As an AmeriCorps VISTA with Brookings Area United Way, you will be part of an exciting time in the non-profit sector. Recently, the Brookings Area United Way and the City of Brookings partnered and was awarded a \$1.6 million dollar Community Development Block Grant to build a 7,200 square foot building to house three food insecurity programs and the United Way offices. This building will help the Brookings community for generations to assist in helping people out of poverty.

Recently, a new program was introduced to the community, Network of Care. This is a data base referral program. The majority of our food insecurity programs do not have a computerized system to track clients and to make referrals. This is a wonderful opportunity for capacity building for these programs but they will need assistance in set up and management.

You will be helping local organizations expand their capacity to make change through capacity building activities such as volunteer recruitment, fundraising and community research. As Brookings Area United Way's Food Security Program VISTA, you will be addressing food insecurity and hunger in our community. You will build the capacity of our United Way and partner organizations to empower BIPOC families living in poverty so that they are better able to access nutritious food and receive health education that helps them maximize their food budgets and cook healthy meals. As a result of your efforts, Brookings Area United Way will better understand what food services are currently available in Brookings County, where service gaps are, and which best practices can be adopted to enhance program impact and leverage resources to better achieve program goals.
